# GUIDELINES

**Eligibility:** Any person with a “tour passport” who can show proof of motorcycle license endorsement by sending a photocopy of their license with completed passport (passenger not required to have endorsement). Only one passport per person accepted.

**Couples:** Couples (riding on the same motorcycle) must use separate “tour passports” to be eligible for prizes.

**Completion Date:** December 31, 2021 all “tour passports” and/or pictures must be post-marked by January 15, 2022.

**Categories:** There will be five categories for the tour; North, Central and South Point of Interest Tours, the ABCs of Indiana Tour, and the Sponsor Tour.

**Tour Patches:** Tour patches will be awarded to first time participants and rockers for those who previously participated.

# AWARD PACKAGE

- 1 A drawing will be held no later than the ABATE Awards Banquet in February 2022.
- 2 A total of \$1,500 cash prizes will be given away.
- 3 The TOTAL cash prize will be divided equally between the tours. \$900 will be divided between the North, Central and South Points of Interest Tours. \$300 will be awarded to the ABCs of Indiana tour. \$300 will be awarded to the Sponsor tour.
- 4 There are a maximum of 120 chances per passport that can be accumulated from the Tour for the drawing of the cash prizes. Participants are eligible to win all cash prizes.
- 5 Anyone accumulating all 120 chances will automatically receive a one-year ABATE of Indiana membership.
- 6 Anyone completing one Points-of-Interest Tour and the ABCs of Indiana Tour will qualify for one chance at an all-events pass for 2022. Additional chances can be earned by adding a picture of the ABATE of Indiana state office, the Indiana State Motorcycle Safety Memorial and/or Coliseum Bingo (Freedom Hall). A total of four chances can be earned for an all-events pass. There will be 14 passes given away.
- 7 If less than three participants complete either category of the tour, the money will be divided equally among those who have participated in any of the tours.





# HOW THE TOUR WORKS

Think of the ABATE of Indiana's "Tour Indiana" program as a statewide scavenger hunt designed to encourage people to get out and ride. If that wasn't incentive enough, you can also win cash prizes! How, you ask?

**Points of Interest** Participants may visit the points of interest listed in this passport. Participants may ride the North Tour (Regions 0, 1, 2, 3, 4), Central Tour (Regions 5, 6, 11, 12) or South Tour (Regions 7, 8, 9, 10, 13) separately, any combination of two, or all three. A Point of Interest is listed in each Region (two in Region 11). There are five points of interest in each of the North, Central and South Tours (15 total). Participants simply take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the point of interest, while displaying the cover of the tour book. Couples (riding the same motorcycle) can take a picture of each other with their motorcycle, while displaying the cover page of the tour book. Participants will qualify for 2 chances per picture to win cash prizes for each of these tours they complete.

**ABCs of Indiana** Participants must take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the name of a city, town or county sign using the alphabet A through Z (there is no X), while displaying the cover of the tour book. Couples (riding the same motorcycle) can take a picture of each other with their motorcycle, while displaying the cover of the tour book. A picture of five of the State Parks and/or State/National Forests is also needed. Participants will receive two chances for each letter of the alphabet, State/National Park or State/National Forest submitted. There are a total of 60 chances available for this tour.

**Sponsor Tour** Visit a sponsor listed on the inside back cover. Participants must take a picture of their motorcycle and themselves in front of the business signage while displaying the cover of the tour book (15 total). Participants will qualify for 2 chances per picture to win cash prizes for this tour. Only one sponsor can be submitted under the same name (i.e. "Pomp's Tire" can only be submitted one time, even though they are listed multiple times). There are currently 31 Sponsors available to choose from for this tour.

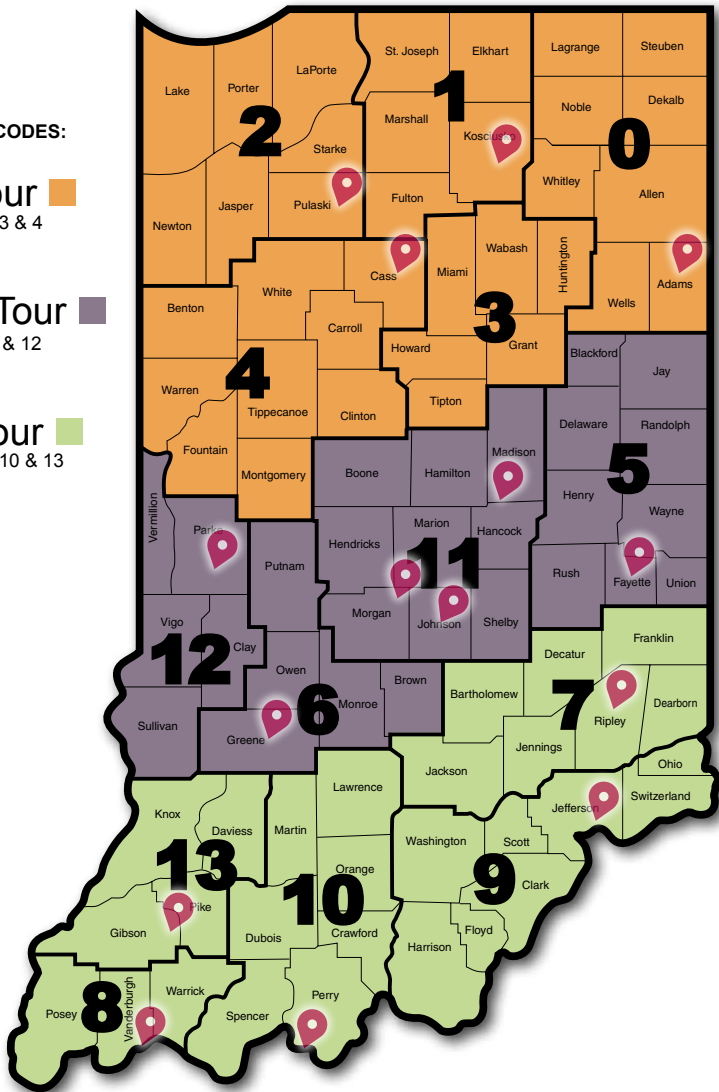

## Peace Monument

Peace Monument is a cenotaph made of Indiana limestone and bronze panels. The front features a figure of a woman representing Peace. She is standing wearing armor and in left hand she wields a shield representing the United States. Her right arm is outstretched and sits upon a laurel twig resting upon four furled flags. She has a sword, which rests in a scabbard, strapped to her left side, just behind the shield showing the United States backs up desire for peace with the power to protect it. The bronze panels on either side of Peace include the names of 1,276 veterans from Adams County. On the reverse features a relief depicting a nurse treating a wounded soldier.

## Chinworth Bridge & Historic Marker

Corner of Lincoln Hwy (Old US 30) & CR 350 W  
Warsaw, IN 46582

The bridge is part of the Tippecanoe River Rest Park and was built in 1897 across the Tippecanoe River by Bellefontaine Bridge and Iron Company of Ohio. The single-span 140-foot iron bridge is the last remaining Pratt truss bridge in the county. U.S. Highway 30 bypassed the location in 1924 and it is now closed to vehicle traffic. Leased by Kosciusko County Historical Society since 1975 and listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1997. The historic marker was placed in 1999. There is also a history story board located in the parking area.

## Weaver Settlement Historic Marker

N 40° 27.957 W 85° 43.240

In 1840, five free Black families moved from North Carolina to Grant County, Indiana, and created the Weaver Settlement, clearing more than 3,000 acres of land. By 1849, Weaver had its first church, and five years later the Baptists built a church that is still standing on the site today. During the Civil War, freed and escaped slaves came to Weaver. After the war, the community grew; businesses and formal schools were built and during its peak, more than 2,000 lived in the community making it one of the earliest and biggest congregations of Black pioneers in Indiana. Racial tensions heightened in 1930 after the lynching of two African American men in Grant County. This was the last known lynching in the state. Over the years, the population of Weaver slowly dwindled, and the building eventually fell down. The remnants of Weaver still remains, protected by a fence that surrounds the majority of the property. The site is now home to playgrounds, huts, and a large grass lawn.

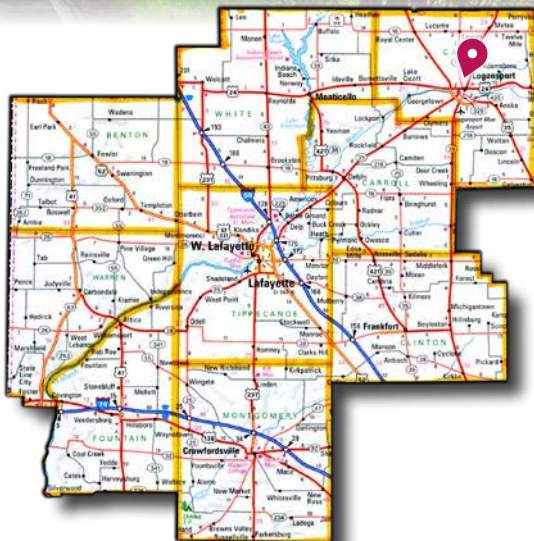

## The Tulip Trestle

0.3 mi of CR 390 N on CR 480 E  
Bloomfield, IN 47424

Also known as the Green County Viaduct, the trestle was begun in 1905 and took a year to complete. It is the longest rail trestle in the United States at 2,295 feet long and the third longest bridge of its kind in the world. The original cost of the viaduct was \$246,5041 which is estimated to be over \$8 million in today's dollars. The structure was designed by the Indianapolis Southern Railway, financed by the Illinois Central Railroad and mostly by Italian immigrants. Used primarily the transportation of coal from Greene County mines to large cities such as Chicago, the line was also used for passenger trains, but the service was discontinued in 1948. The rail line is still used today for freight transportation.

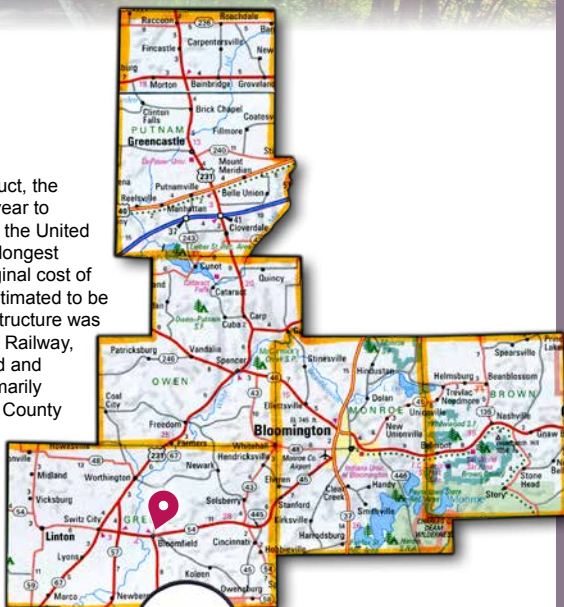

Located on the banks of the Ohio River in southwest Indiana, Angel Mounds State Historic Site is one of the best-preserved, pre-contact Native American

sites in North America. Built between A.D. 1000 and 1450, the town was occupied by more than 1,000 people who were part of the Mississippian culture, and included earthen mounds built to elevate important buildings. The original town covered an area of 103 acres and served as an important religious, political and trade center for people living within a 75-mile radius. More than 600 acres comprise Angel Mounds State Historic Site, which includes an interpretive center, recreations of Mississippian buildings and a working reconstruction of the 1939 Works Progress Administration (WPA) archaeology laboratory. The 500-acre non-archaeological portion of the site contains a nature preserve with hiking and biking trails.

**Lanier Mansion State Historic Site**

James Franklin Doughty Lanier was one of Madison's pioneers. His activities in banking and railroad development made him one of the most important figures in Indiana's history. Lanier moved to Madison in 1817 where he practiced law and served as clerk of the Indiana General Assembly in the 1820s. By 1834, he'd become president of the Madison Branch of the State Bank of Indiana and was a major investor in Indiana's first railroad. Lanier's business success allowed him to hire Madison architect Francis Costigan to design and build the grandest residence in Madison, which was completed in 1844. Francis Costigan designed the mansion with many Greek Revival features. A few of these include the square plan, the full façade porch on the south elevation, the massive exterior entablature and dentilated cornice, and the Ionic columns that separate the double parlors on the first floor

## Civil War Grave

On August 21, 1865, the Steamer USS Argosy (Number 3) was caught in a storm, blown aground and her boilers exploded. Ten fatalities occurred among Union Soldiers returning home from War Service. They were buried in a Mass Grave south of Magnet, Indiana (Rono) where memorial markers perpetuate this burial ground.

The cemetery is located in Union Township on the south side of Parks Road about 0.7 miles south of its intersection with Magnet Valley Road. The cemetery is listed in the Cemetery and Burial Grounds Registry of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and in the State Historical Architectural and Archaeological Research Database (SHAARD) with Cemetery Record Number CR-62-133 (Unknown / Civil War Memorial Cemetery).

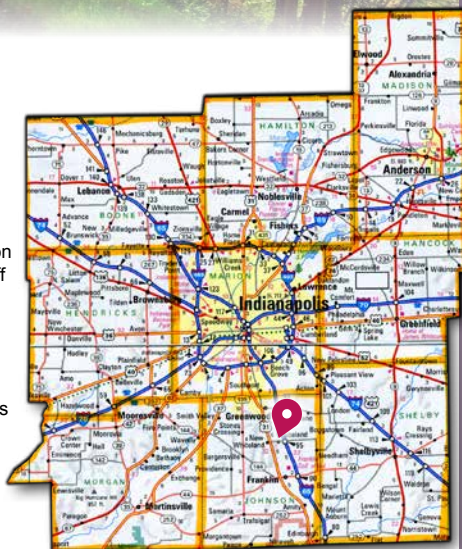

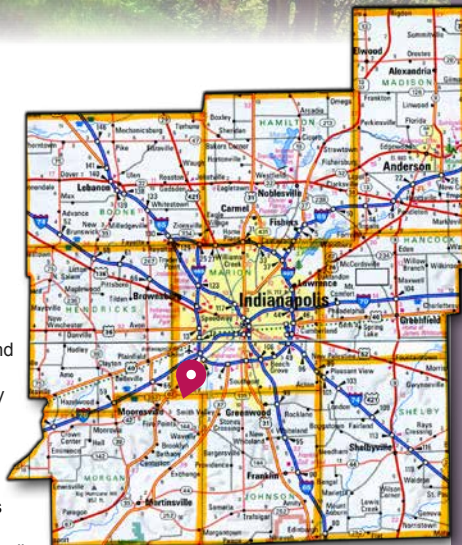
West Newton, Indiana is a small neighborhood located in southwestern Marion County (Decatur Township) founded in 1851 by Quaker settlers. The mural is on the side Jay's Market, located at the corner of S. Mooresville Road & Mendenhall Road. The building has been a market for over 100 years and the current owner, Jay Dhanjal has operated it for 10 years. Jay painted the large American flag and praying soldier in the Summer of 2020. The mural was inspired from his military patrons, and as a way to show support to our troops & fallen soldiers. The mural can be seen on the west side of the market.

## Ritz Theater

Opened in 1912 as the 600-plus seat New Rockville Opera House on W. Ohio Street (later the "New" portion of the name was dropped). For its first 15 or so years, the Opera House presented mostly live acts, but also did feature some silent film screenings as well. It wasn't until 1929, when the Opera House was wired for sound that it switched to mainly movies.

The theater was heavily remodeled in 1937, when its name was changed to the Ritz Theater, and its interior was redone in Art Moderne style, the original Neo-Classical decor all but lost. Also, a new marquee was added at this time, which was itself replaced again in the late-1940's with the current semi-circular shaped Streamline style marquee. It was operated by Affiliated Theaters Inc. of Indianapolis, IN.

The Ritz Theater closed as a movie house in 1969, but was purchased from its last owner by the Rockville Chamber of Commerce. It has been the home of the Parke Players since 1971, and since that time, has been constantly under renovation and restoration. The Players continue to present live theater on the Ritz' stage today. In 2012 it was equipped with a digital projector and now screens first-run movies.

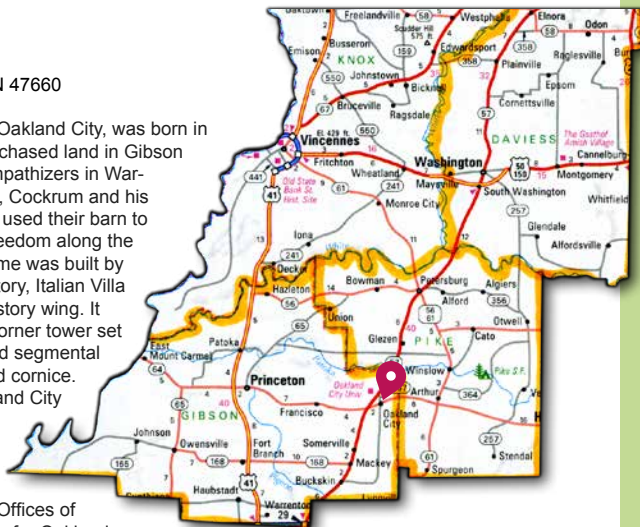


## Cockrum Hall

James Cockrum, a resident of Oakland City, was born in 1799 in North Carolina and purchased land in Gibson County in 1818. Along with sympathizers in Warrick, Gibson and Pike Counties, Cockrum and his son, William Monroe Cockrum, used their barn to aid enslaved Blacks seeking freedom along the Underground Railroad. The home was built by William in 1876, and is a two-story, Italian Villa style brick dwelling with a one-story wing. It features a three-story square corner tower set at a 45 degree angle, round and segmental arched windows, and bracketed cornice. His home, located on the Oakland City University campus, was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978. With restoration completed in 2002, Cockrum Hall now houses the Offices of Development and Alumni Affairs for Oakland City University.
